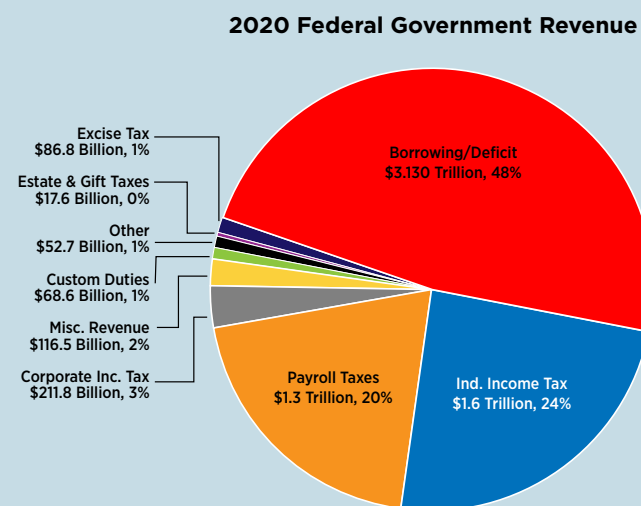
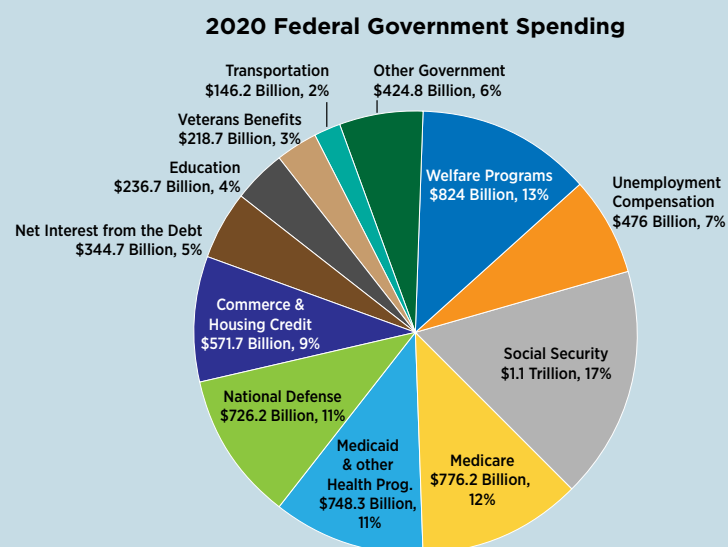
Constituent Report Card: 2020 By-the-Numbers

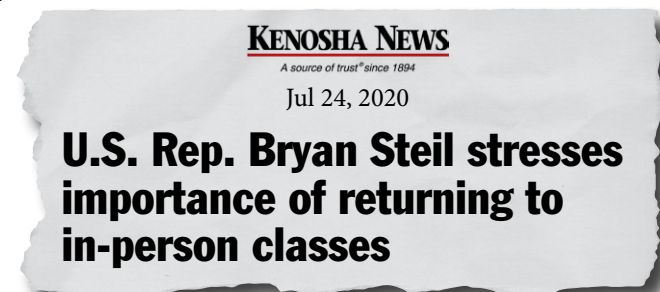
Bryan Steil: Combating the Coronavirus and Getting Wisconsin Back to Work Bringing Federal Resources and Helpful Information to Southeast Wisconsin During COVID-19:

- **Virtual Children's Mental Health Forum:** Parents, doctors, and panelists from a variety of local, state, and federal organizations provided insight on mental health challenges facing our children and best practices, especially during the coronavirus crisis.
- **Telephone Town Hall with Wisconsin Department of Health Services Secretary:** In March, thousands from across the First District participated in a telephone town hall with Congressman Steil and Wisconsin DHS to ask their questions on the coronavirus, how to prevent spreading it, and how to keep our communities healthy.
- **Coronavirus Scam Prevention Telephone Town Hall:** Congressman Steil, the Federal Trade Commission, Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, and AARP provided information to our community on how to prevent, identify, and report scams during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- **Telephone Town Hall with Wisconsin Parents on Coronavirus Impacts on Schools:** Congressman Steil spoke directly to Wisconsin parents on the importance of having students in the classroom.

Bryan Steil: Honoring Our Veterans

Representing a district that is home to more than 45,000 veterans, Congressman Steil is committed to honoring their service.

- Hiring a Wounded Warrior Fellow to handle veteran outreach, veteran and military casework, and service academy nominations.
- Calling for a federal investigation into the COVID-19 outbreak at the Wisconsin Veterans Home at Union Grove.
- Pushing for federal grants to expand operations and restore infrastructure at veteran cemeteries, like the Southern Wisconsin Veterans Memorial Cemetery in Union Grove.
- Awarding Steven Perrigo as the 2020 Veteran of the Year Award Recipient. Highly-decorated, Perrigo served in the U.S. Army in the Korean DMZ for fourteen months.
